Day	Psalm	Reading
Palm Sunday	22	Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that in due time he might exalt you, And after you have suffered a little while, the God of grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, establish, and strengthen you, To him be the dominion for ever and ever, Amen <i>1 Peter 4:6, 10-11</i>
Monday	119:1-8, 17-24	God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us. <i>Romans 5:8</i>
Tuesday	119:89-96, 105-112	I will pour out on the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem a spirit of compassion and supplication, so that, when they look on him whom they have pierced, they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for an only child, and weep bitterly over him, as one weeps for a first-born. <i>Zechariah 12:10</i>
Wednesday	40	In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard for his godly fear. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. <i>Hebrews 5:7-8</i>
Maundy Thursday	42	We see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. For it was fitting that he, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through suffering. <i>Hebrews 2:9-10</i>
Good Friday	51	All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. <i>Isaiah 53:6</i>
